


Denzil Forrester : Night Out


This is an Intarsia knit scarf using monochrome shades with duplicate stitch detail added after knitting.

Knitted on 5mm needles using Aran weight yarn.
(200g white, 50g each dark grey, light grey and black)

- cast on 45 sts
- knit 10 rows stocking st in white
- follow the pattern chart below for the intarsia design.
- knit 34 rows stocking st in white.
- repeat the chart (from marker)
- knit a final 10 rows in white and cast off.

Artist Biography

Born in Grenada in 1956, Denzil Forrester moved to London in 1967. Forrester's works immortalise the dynamic energy of the London reggae and dub nightclub scene during the early 1980s. The artist's expressive depictions of dance halls, clubs and of carnival, capture the energy and rhythm of crowds. Flashes of vivid colour, gestural brushstrokes and frenetic compositions characterise his work.

Forrester's works have been exhibited internationally at venues including The Studio Museum in Harlem, New York; Tate Britain, London; Ashmolean Museum, Oxford, among many others.

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
